During "Rebuilding Day" in May 2005, we helped 10 families by replacing four roofs, installed 30 new windows, three new doors, provided electrical/heating repairs for four homes, and fixed numerous safety hazards for five of the houses. At the end of the day, it is incredibly satisfying to view the results achieved with the support from 120 volunteers and the generous financial support of our sponsors.

We have a successful formula that works locally, by having a dedicated board of directors, and nationally with more than 250 affiliates across the country. Thank you for the continued support and we look forward to seeing you again on April 29, 2006 for our next "Rebuilding Day."
